



## How wide should a locker be?

Allow corridor widths of approximately 1000mm minimum especially in schools and consider the space for when opening doors. You also need to consider the position of any windows or doors. Make sure your lockers will not block access to any windows or doors which still need to be opened.

## How do I choose a locker?

Take note of things like skirting boards, radiators, heating pipes, light switches, and sockets etc. Make sure you install on a strong, level and even surface, are the floors level?

#### How much space should a locker have?

Measurements of the area need to be specific and you have to allow approximately 4mmextra at the sides of each locker. Allow corridor widths of approximately 1000mm minimum especially in schools and consider the space for when opening doors. You also need to consider the position of any windows or doors.

## What is the difference between a door panel and a lock stile?

Lock stile - This is the vertical edge of the door which sits on the opposite side of the door to the hinges, and contains the lock or latch. Panel - The panels, which may be timber or glass, are what fill the frame formed by the stiles and rails of a door.

## Can a locker be fixed to a wall?

Most lockers are tall and thin, depending on your requirements and specifications but they could be unstable if they are not fixed to the wall or each other. A single run of lockers must be secured to a suitable anchor point with a suitable bracing mechanism.

## What makes a perfect locker layout?

The key to a perfect layout is to achieve a balance of comfort and usabilitywhilst optimising your available space. So,the first requirement is to establish the number of users and available space allocated for the lockers.
