Should wind power grow to 320 gigawatts by 2030?

But the authors warned that the wind industry must increase its annual growth to at least 320 gigawatts by 2030in order to meet the COP28 pledge to triple the world's installed renewable energy generation capacity by 2030, as well as to meet the Paris Agreement's ambition of capping global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 Fahrenheit).

How much electricity does the UK generate from wind?

Wind electricity generation in the UK In 2020, the UK generated 75,610 gigawatt hours (GWh) of electricity from both offshore and onshore wind. This would be enough to power 8.4 trillion LED light bulbs. Individually, both offshore and onshore wind electricity generation has grown substantially since 2009.
