Is Laos the battery of Southeast Asia?

The Xayaburi Hydroelectric Power Plant, the largest in Laos, was completed in 2019. A more powerful dam on the Mekong River is already in the pipeline. VIENTIANE: With electricity exports to Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, Myanmar, Malaysia and even Singapore, Laos has arguably realised its ambition to be the battery of Southeast Asia.

How much hydropower does Laos have?

Laos has an enormous hydropower potential of more than 18,000 MW, excluding the main stream of the Mekong River and up to 27,000 MW with it. Total installed hydro capacity is about 7,213 MW, which produces some 24,204 GWh per year.

How much power does Laos have?

Current status As of end 2019, Laos had an installed power generation capacity of nearly 9,972 MW, of which over 80 per cent or 8,019 MW was contributed by hydropower. Coal-based power accounted for 19 per cent share (1,878 MW) while the rest was accounted for by biomass and solar (75 MW).

Can Laos achieve its electricity ambitions?

With 42 power plants now operational, Laos is poised to realise its electricity ambitions. With a current installed capacity of approximately 6,000 MW, the Lao government expects to achieve 14,000 MW by the end of this year. Thailand is not on its own with massive development and expansion putting pressure on the older ways of life.

Should Laos rethink its hydropower strategy?

Gary Lee is the Southeast Asia programme director of International Rivers. "Laos should reconsider its strategy and its reliance on large-scale hydropower development as a means of revenue generation," he urged.

How much power will Laos have by 2025?

As per the Laos Power Development Plan, the country's hydropower capacity is expected to reach over 14 GW by 2025 while coal-based power capacity would increase to 2.5 GW. The total generation is expected to be around 82,733 GWh by 2025.

Laos started power exports to Singapore in 2022 and completed building transmission infrastructure for selling electricity to Cambodia in 2023. Most energy is exported instead of used domestically, amounting to more than half of all electricity consumed in Laos and 77 percent of total hydropower generation in 2019. The agreement enabled Thailand to buy power from Laos, which generates surplus electricity from dams along the Mekong river, to be sold to Malaysia. Now, the project is set to transition to the second phase under which Thailand will increase the amount of electricity that it buys from Laos from 100 MW to 300 MW.

The country currently imports 25 percent of its electricity from Laos, Vietnam and Thailand. Number of power plants soon to be completed by the end of 2020: 53 hydropower plants under construction or in the planning stage, including those set to be completed this year; there will be more than 90 hydropower plants in Laos with a combined installed capacity of almost 14,000 MW.

The government has ambitions to become the "Battery of Southeast Asia" by exploiting its impressive hydropower potential. By 2020-2021, an extra 50 hydropower plants with a total capacity of 5,606 MW will be in service. A total output of 27,024 GWh is anticipated and by 2025, Laos expects to export 14,600 MW to neighboring countries.
