



Logic energy South Georgia and South Sandwich Islands

The South Sandwich Islands (Spanish: Islas Sandwich del Sur) are a chain of uninhabited volcanic islands in the South Atlantic Ocean. They are administered as part of the British Overseas Territory of South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands.

Along with the nearby South Sandwich islands, South Georgia is the most southerly outpost of the British Empire. It was first sighted by a London merchant in 1675 and claimed by James Cook in 1775 ...

We partnered with the Pew Bertarelli Ocean Legacy, Great Blue Ocean coalition, and Blue Nature Alliance to help designate a South Atlantic Marine Wildlife Sanctuary in South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands.

Options for the future management of South Georgia and the South Sandwich Islands are considered at the end of the paper. Some management proposals, though suggested in 2012 and 2013, were only implemented by GSGSSI in 2019, after the first five-yearly review.
