In terms of its oil reserves, the country is one of the richest in sub-Saharan Africa, ranking 5th after Nigeria, Angola, Sudan, South Sudan, and Uganda.

Is Gabon a member of OPEC?

Gabon, a former OPEC member (1975-1994) that rejoined in 2016, is the sixth-largest oil producer in sub-Saharan Africa. The first national oil company was the Soci t  Nationale Petroli re Gabonaise but it was disbanded in 1987. The government of Gabon controls all petroleum and mineral rights within the state.

Is biomass a source of electricity in Gabon?

Traditional biomass - the burning of charcoal, crop waste, and other organic matter - is not included. This can be an important source in lower-income settings. Who controls the oil industry in Gabon?

The government of Gabon controls all petroleum and mineral rights within the state. In 2011 a presidential decree created the Gabon Oil Company (GOC). This new entity works in partnership with international companies operating in Gabon and operates two fields: Obangue and Remboue.
