

## **Premierenergy Monaco**

The energy consumed by buildings is responsible for 35% of Monaco''s greenhouse gas emissions. This is a significant figure in terms of the Principality''s CO 2 emissions goals: the country is targeting a 55% reduction by 2030 and carbon neutrality by 2050.

There are now more than 80 seawater heat pumps throughout Monaco. Among the most iconic are those at Grimaldi Forum, the Oceanographic Museum, the Rainier III Auditorium and SBM"s hotels and restaurants. These two new ocean thermal energy loops will enable a large number of buildings to benefit from this "clean" energy source.

Romanian energy company Premier Energy plans to expand its renewable energy portfolio by 50% to 1.5GW up to 2026, Reuters has reported. The company, owned by Czech investment holding company Emma Capital, is also set to continue its investments in neighbouring Moldova.
