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Construction and start-up will take approximately 18 months. The project consists of a fully integrated 35.7 MW solar photovoltaic system (solar field) and a 14.8 MW / 45.7 MWh lithium-ion battery energy storage system (BESS) utilizing Leclanché's proprietary energy management system software.

The Government of St. Kitts and Nevis, along with SKELEC, the state-owned St. Kitts Electricity Company Ltd, have executed an amended Power Purchase Agreement (PPA) with SOLEC Power Ltd, a subsidiary JV of Leclanché, for the solar photovoltaic and battery storage project located in Basseterre.

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The Lechlanche Solar-powered Farm will be the largest solar farm in the Caribbean. He also disclosed that the
