What are solar panel import tariffs?

Solar panel import tariffs are primarily intended to support the development of a new U.S.-based solar module manufacturing supply chain, which is financially backed by the Inflation Reduction Act. This act introduces a series of tax credits designed to bolster domestic manufacturers. For solar modules, the credits are as follows:

What if China imposes new solar tariffs on imports from Southeast Asia?

When the presidential moratorium on new solar tariffs on imports from Southeast Asia expires next June, imports of solar cells and modules from these five companies will be subject to the tariffs faced by Chinese solar manufacturers, with the tariff level ranging from 50 percent to 250 percent of the import value.

What tariffs did Trump impose on solar panels?

Following lawsuits by Suniva, the Trump administration implemented two additional tariffs: Section 201 & Section 301, applying to solar modules and hundreds of other items, respectively. The Section 201 tariff imposed a 30% import tariff on all solar modules from all countries, decreasing 5% annually until its scheduled end.

Will the US impose a tariff on solar energy in 2024?

Now, in 2024, as the solar industry strives to fully scale and establish itself, the U.S. has imposed five import tariffs, one geographical import ban, and has also recently initiated an additional tariff case now under investigation.

Why are US solar tariffs affecting global solar prices?

The U.S. tariff decisions follow a surge in Chinese exports which have driven down global solar prices and raised fears over the future of U.S. and European solar manufacturers. Global panel prices fell almost 50% last year, according to the International Energy Agency (IEA).
