Gambian utility Nawec is seeking proposals for a 50 MW PV plant planned to be deployed in Soma, south of the Gambia River. The project is part of a broader solar project that will eventually include unspecified battery storage capacity.

President Adama Barrow Saturday laid the foundation for the construction of a 23 Mega Watt Solar Plant and an eight Mega Watt Battery Energy Storage System, with three years of operations and maintenance.

Gambia"s Ministry of Petroleum and Energy and utility National Water and Electricity Company (Nawec) have invited independent power producer (IPP) developers to submit a request for qualification (RFQ) for the first stage of the Soma solar-storage project.

The project will consist of three components: (1) a grid-connected photovoltaic (PV) power plant with a total installed capacity of 10 MW including an associated battery energy storage Ssation (BESS), (2) a number of off-grid PV and BESS units for rural health clinics, secondary schools and food manufacturing and storage facilities and (3 ...
